at once a revered canon associated with Confucius and the earliest anthology of poetry the book of poems holds a

unique place in Chinese literary history since early imperial times it served as an ideal of literary perfection as it provided a basis for defining shi poetry the most esteemed genre of elite composition in imperial China however literary criticism and classical learning represented distinct fields of inquiry that differed in status with classical learning considered more serious and prestigious literary critics thus highlighted connections between the book of poems and later verse while classical scholars obscured the origins of their ideas in literary theory this book explores the mutual influence of literary and classicizing approaches which frequently and fruitfully borrowed from one another drawing on a wide range of sources including commentaries anthologies colophons and inscriptions Bruce Rusk chronicles how scholars borrowed from critics without attribution and even resorted to forgery to make appealing new ideas look old by unraveling the relationships

commission cases decided in 2004 and 2009 they also consider broader issues of competition policy in the age of globalization addressing the adequacy of today's antitrust laws their enforcement by multiple parties around the world and the difficulty of obtaining effective remedies all lessons learned from the microsoft cases alan t wood examines the cultural identity of modern china in the context of authoritarianism in the chinese political tradition taking on issues of key importance in the understanding of chinese history wood leads readers to a reconsideration of neo confucian thinkers of the northern sung dynasty modern scholars have accused sung neo confucians of advocating a doctrine of unconditional obedience to the ruler of revering the emperor and expelling the barbarian and thereby inhibiting the rise of democracy in china wood refutes this dominant view by arguing that sung neo confucians intended to limit the

power of the emperor not enhance it sung political thinkers believed passionately in the existence of a moral cosmos governed by universal laws that transcended the ruler and could be invoked to set limits on his power wood makes a striking comparison of this view with a similar one of universal morality or natural law that developed in late medieval europe by drawing attention to a much neglected confucian text he contributes significantly to the wider dialog of human rights in china and brings forth fresh philosophical insights in his comparative view of chinese and western history the papyri transmit a part of the testimonia relevant to pre socratic philosophy the 'corpus dei papiri filosofici' takes this material only partly into account in this volume a team of specialists discusses some of the most important papyrological texts that are major instruments for reconstructing pre socratic philosophy and doxography furthermore these texts help to increase our knowledge of how

pre socratic thought through contributions to physics cosmology ethics ontology theology anthropology hermeneutics and aesthetics paved the way for the canonic scientific fields of european culture more specifically each paper tackles published and unpublished papyrological texts concerning the orphics the milesians heraclitus empedocles anaxagoras the early atomists and the sophists for the first time in the field of pre socratics studies several papers are devoted to the herculanean sources along with others concerning the graeco egyptian papyri and the derveni papyrus the first two books of aristotle s on the heavens de caelo offers perspectives on the cosmology of a thinker whose ideas in this area were considered authoritative by many until the 17th century of our era a collection of essential versions of the art of war includes the art of war mastering the art of war the lost art of war and the silver sparrow art of war in a volume complemented by

only a text of the poem is required earl miner is townsend martin class of 1917 professor of english and comparative literature at princeton university william moeck teaches english at nassau community college steven jablonski is a public librari excerpt from a commentary on ecclesiastes the following commentary differs from many of its predecessors in the greater weight given to the interpretation of the lxx and the closer investigation of their peculiar renderings in many cases these strange renderings on the part of the lxx are dismissed by commentators as simply errors but this is not consistent with what true criticism ought to do the lxx is not only the oldest translation we have but also the only one made when hebrew was yet a living language its peculiar renderings then deserve our most serious attention the investigation of them will fully reward the inquirer this then is the cause of the special line of interpretation adopted in this

commentary with regard to the book of ecclesiastes itself the writer must confess himself homo unius tibri for some years past all his hebrew and greek studies have been devoted to the investigation of the meaning of this one book in the sacred canon and all his conclusions must be taken with the reservation that they apply directly to this one book alone such a concentration of effort may be expected to produce results which might not be arrived at by a far wider and more extensive research just as a few rays of sunlight concentrated by a small lens will bum where the sun himself will only warm nevertheless this book does not profess to be anything in the nature of a new discovery sense is attempted to be made of difficult passages by what may be called a microscopic attention to the grammar of the writer and a minute and careful analysis of every form and expression he uses about the publisher forgotten books publishes hundreds of thousands of rare and classic books find more at
