allusions to the phallus in the flea while the comparison parodies the adoration poem with references to the sweat drops of my mistress breast like William Shakespeare in his parody sonnet my mistress eyes are nothing like the sun Donne sends up the Petrarchan and courtly love genre with gross comparisons like spermatic issue of ripe menstuous boils in the bait there is the archetypal Renaissance opening line come live with me and be my love as used by Christopher Marlowe and William Shakespeare among others and there is the complex ambivalent eroticism of the extasie a much celebrated love poem and the 19th elegy where features Donne's famous couplet licence my roving hands and let them go before behind between above below the songs and sonnets of John Donne celebrate the many emotions of love feelings that are so familiar in love poetry from Sappho to Adrienne Rich Donne does not quite cover every emotion of love but a good deal of them in the canonization we find the age-old Neo-Platonic belief that two can become as one we two being one or we shall be one he writes in *Lovers Infirmities* a common belief in love poetry John Donne's love poetry like nearly all love poetry self-reflexive although he would never parted be as he writes in *Song Sweetest Love I do not go* he knows that love poetry comes out of loss the beloved woman is not there so art takes her place the songs and sonnets arise from loss loss of love they take the place of love for if he were clasping his beloved in those feverish embraces as described in the extasie and elegy he would not obviously bother with poetry love poetry has this ambivalent difficult relationship with love the poem is not love and is no real substitute for it and writing of love exacerbates the pain and the insecurity of the experience of love with an introduction and bibliography illustrated with new pictures the text has been revised for this edition also available in an e-book edition crmoon.com

2008 in the subject didactics english literature works grade 2 0 national university of ireland maynooth english department course renaissance and restoration language english abstract introduction john donne was born in 1572 to catholic parents converted to anglicanism married anne more secretly and became dean of st pauls at the age of 39 he is known as an erotically charged religious poet whose sacred and profane poems seem equally passionate but he is also famous for his metaphysical poems metaphysical poetry typically had a special conceit a metaphor like donne s metaphor of the compass and unites two usually opposing motives like sex and religion this brief introduction into the life of john donne shows that he has a certain obsession towards both religion and sex as a man of the church he converted to anglicanism and became dean of st pauls but as a lover of a woman he secretly married his beloved wife keeping these facts in mind i will exemplarily analyse two of donne s poems namely the flea and elegy xx to his mistress going to bed to find out whether sex and religion really are modifications of the same energy in donne s metaphysical poems the flea the poem consists of 3 stanzas with 9 lines each and the meter alternates between iambic tetrameter and iambic pentameter the rhyme scheme is a rhyming couplet following the pattern aabbccddd the final line rhymes with the final couplet the first hint on a common origin of sex and religion is the form of the poem it has three stanzas but the rhyme scheme is a rhyming couplet apart from the last line three as an uneven number is a divine number representing the trinity whereas two as an even number is a worldly number mirroring all profane like adam and eve representing mankind nevertheless these modifications of the form derive from the same origin the poem as a whole the three stanzas of the poem tell of a man and a woman that are both bitten by a flea in the first stanza the flea bites the speaker first and is about to bite the woman by doing this the flea unites their bloods in its body in renaissance times exchanging fluids was thought to happen when two people

John Donne and the Line of Wit 2008 john donne and the line of wit from metaphysical to modernist is a study of influence adaptation historical imitation and invention in his own time donne was celebrated for his distinctive style especially for what his contemporaries recognized as strong lines that is witty conceits or unusual often unexpected and surprising comparisons donne s metaphysical wit fell out of fashion in the later seventeenth century not to be significantly explored and revived until the early twentieth century and then notably by the modernist movement in the years that followed eliot s waste land 1922 among the most important and earliest of poets and critics to respond to this movement are the self styled fugitives of the southern united states as fugitives they stood against what seemed old and shop worn language and they gave their name and talent to the literary journal published at vanderbilt university from 1922 25 the fugitive provided an outlet for the work of john crowe ransom robert penn warren allen tate and others who discovered a new modernism that might be shaped out of the old metaphysical mode of donne their poetry is characteristically concerned with verbal or metaphysical invention usually composed with metrical formality and from an objective detached point of view
