composition and performance the role of public and private institutions in fostering and sustaining creative activity throughout the course of musical careers and the ways in which genres and scenes themselves age over time birthing a nation is about national identity and the american west if it is a truism that facing west was the american male version of invoking the muse what happened if you were female most past interpretations of western american literature have echoed frederick jackson turner s frontier hypothesis emphasizing the conflict of wilderness and civilization the hero of rugged individualism the act of returning to origins and reemerging as the reborn american adam in this reading of western american women writers who responded to the challenge to give birth to a nation susan j rosowski proposes an alternative more hopeful affirmation of our cultural history and perhaps our cultural destiny rosowski begins by tracing the birth metaphor through three and a half centuries of american letters she reexamines the premises underlying the telling of the literary west and posits a female model of creativity at the genesis of american literature she follows four authors on a multigenerational journey beginning with margaret fuller in 1843 moving on a generation later to willa cather advancing to jean stafford and ending with marilynne robinson in her reading of these writers who most directly and deeply

a nation of listeners some of her lectures radio addresses and newspaper chronicles were later published as essays and now constitute a distinct genre within her work in this study blixen s most important essays are critically examined for the first time the book demonstrates that a creative dialectic informs these essays an interplay of complementary opposites that blixen sees as fundamental to human life and artistic creativity whether exploring questions of gender and the status of the feminist movement or the reign of national socialism in hitler s germany or colonial race relations under british rule in east africa blixen s observations are insightful witty and surprisingly progressive for an author notable for aristocratic sensibilities blixen s essays are also framed by a dialectic method which develops an idea by drawing on opposing viewpoints in order to arrive at an original vantage point the creative dialectic of karen blixen s essays builds on archival research historical study literary criticism and theory as well as bilingual readings of blixen s renowned literary work for the first time in an english translation karen blixen s essay blacks and whites in africa 1938 by award winning translator tiina nunnally appears in this publication despite enormous changes in patterns of dating and courtship in twenty first century america contemporary understandings of romance and intimacy remain firmly rooted in age old assumptions of

gender difference these tenacious beliefs now vie with cultural messages of gender equality that stress independence self development and egalitarian practices in public and private life through interviews with heterosexual and lgbtq individuals ellen lamont s the mating game explores how people with diverse sexualities and gender identities date form romantic relationships and make decisions about future commitments as they negotiate uncertain terrain fraught with competing messages about gender sexuality and intimacy while postcolonial creative

writing in english has come of age in south asia scholarly examination of this rich body of writing has remained largely confined to the narrow domain of literary criticism this unusual and well written book instead foregrounds issues relating to identity nationalism and gender in contemporary literary writing to do so the author has analysed select works which are located within and grapple with four recent periods which have played a significant role in refashioning the nations in the region the emergency in india the ethnic conflict in sri lanka the secession of bangladesh and

zia ul haq s regime in pakistan in examining the literary representation of these critical junctures neluka silva draws upon key aspects of postcolonial nationalist and feminist theory which have influenced both the understanding of the concerned episodes and the literary productions of the authors selected by providing an implicit comparative frame of reference the author succeeds in suggesting ways in which certain choices reinforce or subvert established power relations in the fraught arena of nationalist politics in the four south asian countries
